

Veteran Parking Program – Dallas Love Field

Love Field is pleased to offer complimentary self-parking to disabled veterans with vehicles displaying mounted license plates with a Disabled Veteran (DV) or other Meritorious Military Honors designation.

Love Field follows the Texas Transportation Code, §681.008 – PARKING PRIVILEGES: CERTAIN VETERANS AND MILITARY AWARD RECIPIENTS when waiving self-parking fees for eligible veterans. **Qualifying license plates are listed as follows:**

Disabled Veteran License Plates: Vehicles bearing Disabled Veteran license plates issued by the State of Texas or any other U.S. state that indicate on the face of the license plate that the owner of the vehicle is a Disabled Veteran of the United States armed forces.

Military Specialty License Plates: Vehicles bearing any of the following specialty license plates issued by the State of Texas:

- Air Medal
- Air Medal with Valor
- Airman's Medal
- Bronze Star Medal
- Bronze Star Medal with Valor
- Coast Guard Medal
- Commendation Medal with Valor
- Congressional Medal of Honor
- Defense Meritorious Service Medal
- Defense Superior Service Medal
- Distinguished Flying Cross
- Distinguished Flying Cross with Valor
- Distinguished Service Medal
- Legion of Merit Medal
- Legion of Valor
 - Air Force Cross
 - Army Distinguished Service Cross
 - Distinguished Service Cross
 - Medal of Honor
 - Navy Cross
- Meritorious Service Medal
- Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal
- Navy and Marine Corps Medal
- Pearl Harbor Survivor
- Prisoner of War Medal
- Purple Heart
- Silver Star Medal
- Soldier's Medal
- WW II Veteran

To be eligible to participate in the Veteran Parking Program, Love Field requires that at the time of the transaction, the vehicle be:

- Operated by or for the use of the eligible veteran to whom it is registered
- Issued and properly displaying a qualifying specialty plate
- Operate on a participating Love Field Parking Garage

Am I eligible for the Veteran Parking Program?

To find out if you are eligible for one of the qualifying specialty license plates, visit the Texas Constitution and Statutes website. Any problems or discrepancies with vehicle registrations or with specialty license plates must be resolved between the vehicle owner and the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.

What parking areas are included in Love Field's Veteran Parking Program?

Complimentary Self-Parking is available in Garage A, Garage B, and Garage C. Please be careful to observe posted signage throughout the garages as some spaces are restricted to all by time and vehicle type.

Note: Valet Parking Services, Premium Level and Reserved Spaces are not applicable to this program.

How to I participate in the Love Field's Veteran Parking Program?

Eligible veterans displaying a qualifying specialty license plate issued by the State of Texas or any other U.S. state will first need to opt out of NTTA Tolltag System access for Love Field (if applicable), and pull a parking ticket when entering the garage. Eligible veterans do not need to sign up or enroll to receive complimentary self-parking.

Please exit using an attended cashier lane to show proper identification and receive the benefit.

What if I'm a veteran but do not have a qualifying veteran's license plate?

Self-Parking fees will only be waived for vehicles displaying a qualifying specialty license plate.

What are the requirements to qualify for a disabled veteran license plate?

Veterans can apply for the specialty license plate if they are certified by the Veterans Administration to have a 50 percent service related disability, or 40 percent due to amputation of a lower extremity. Details about how to apply for the plates are available at the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles website.

What if I have multiple cars? What about my spouse's car?

The qualifying veteran must be in the vehicle with an eligible specialty license plate for self-parking charges to be waived. Eligibility in the Love Field Veteran Parking Program is limited to vehicles displaying qualifying specialty plates issued by the State of Texas or any other U.S. state, per Texas Transportation Code §372.053.
